

Information for Authors

The *Journal of Ocean University of China* (Oceanic and Coastal Sea Research) is a comprehensive academic quarterly sponsored by the Ocean University of China, published one volume per year. This journal is devoted to the publication of the theoretical and applied research results on oceanography and marine fisheries. The fields covered include the physical, chemical, biological, geological, environmental, engineering and technological aspects of these sciences. The types of papers include research papers, notes, technical reports, science and technology letters, reviews and overviews, etc.

1. Submission of paper

Authors are requested to submit original papers that have not been published previously and are not under consideration for publication elsewhere in the same form, in English or any other languages.

2. Manuscript preparation

General: The language of this Journal is English, the spelling being British or American, but not a mixture of them. Two duplicate copies of manuscripts (in Word for Windows, 12 pt Times New Roman font) must be type-written double-spaced with wide margins on one side of white paper of generally no more than 20 pages (A4 size). All pages must be correctly numbered. In addition, the papers must also be submitted electronically.

Title: The title of the paper should be informative. Authors should avoid using chemical or mathematical formulas in titles.

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Abstract: The essential contents of the paper should be recapitulated briefly in an abstract of no more than 5 percent of the paper in English.

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For Chinese authors, the following items should be submitted also in Chinese: the title, author(s), work unit(s), abstract, and keywords.

Units: Authors are requested to comply with the standard use of physical quantities and units of the System

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Acknowledgements: Acknowledgements should follow the text and not appear as footnotes.

References: References should be arranged alphabetically by author's last name. The text citation consists of the author's name and year of publication, e.g., "according to Munk (1970)" or "This is in agreement with the results obtained later (Munk, 1976)". References should be given in the following forms:

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Footnotes: Unpublished papers cited, individual letters, internal data of certain institutions, supporting programs, etc., should be included as footnotes.

3. Revision and Acceptance

Revision: Authors are requested to return one copy of the revised manuscript and submit the text in one electronic file (in Word for Windows) within a month. It is essential that the name and version of the word processing program, and the format of the text files be clearly indicated. If available, electronic files of the figures should also be included on a separate floppy disk.

Acceptance: Manuscripts, once accepted, will be published in the forms of research papers, notes, reports, letters, reviews or overviews. For each paper, the author or the first author will receive 30 free reprints after his/her paper has been published.
