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Information for Authors

PURPOSE:

The Journal of Science and Innovation (JSI) is published by the **Taiwanese Institute of Knowledge Innovation (TIKI)**¹ and **Airiti Press**. The Journal is the quarterly journal devoted to advancing the understanding and practice of information and design innovation. It serves the needs of researchers as well as practitioners and executives involved in science and innovation. The review process is double-blind.

The Journal aims to offer an integrated view of the field by presenting approaches of multiple disciplines. The Journal accepts empirical and interpretive submissions that make a significant novel contribution to the field of science and innovation. Such contributions may present:

- experimental, theoretical, or survey-based research, relevant to the progress of science and innovation;
- paradigmatic designs and applications;
- investigation of organizational, societal, and international issues of science and innovation.

SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPTS:

Manuscripts for consideration for the JSI should be submitted electronically by (<http://aspers.airiti.com/JSI/>). Submit manuscripts on A4 (210 x 297 mm) or 8 1/2 x 11 inch white paper. Only English-language manuscripts are acceptable.

Manuscripts must be typewritten, in *single spacing throughout (including tables, references and legends)* and be within the range of 8,000 to 10,000 words. Manuscripts of more than 12,000 words will be returned without comments. There are neither submission fees nor page charges. Each table should be typed on a separate sheet. Legends to figures should be typed in a single series and placed at the end of the manuscript. The first page of the manuscript needs to include (a) the paper's title, (b) the author's name, title, current address, telephone, fax numbers, and e-mail address, and (c) an abstract of 150 to 200 words, about 5 to 10 keywords. Divide the text of the manuscript into numbered sections, beginning with 1 for an Introduction that places the subject of the manuscript into context and cites references to previous related work. Typical main headings for other numbered sections include: Theory, Model, Method, Experiments, Procedures, Results, Discussion, Conclusions or Summary, References and Appendixes (if needed). Main sections may include several subsections. Recognition of significant personal contributions or financial support should appear in an Acknowledgments section after Conclusions.

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The authors may also suggest two to four reviewers for the manuscript (*JSI* may designate other reviewers).

FIGURES AND TABLES:

All illustrations, including algorithms and charts, should be referred to as "Figures." Figure legends and tables can be included in the text file. Figures should be sent as separate files. Figures and tables should be numbered consecutively as they appear in text; all figures and tables must be cited at least once. Tables should be created in MS Word rather than a special table-making program.

REFERENCES:

All references should be listed at the end of the text in the order in which they are cited. References should be cited within the text in numerical order according to their order of appearance. The numbered reference citation should be enclosed in brackets, e.g., "It was shown by Lam [1] that..." In the case of two citations, the numbers should be separated by a comma [1, 2]. In the case of more than two reference citations, the numbers should be separated by a dash [5-8]. The reference style needs to follow the following examples:

Journal Articles: Author(s), **journal volume**(number) (year of publication) inclusive page numbers, e.g. C.T. Lin, M.L. Tsai, L.W. Ji, **J. Sci. Innov.** 1(1) (2009) 15-26. In case of more than six authors use "et al." after the third name.

Books: Author(s), title, edition. publisher: city of publication (year of publication) e.g. C.T. Lin, L.W. Ji, **Fractal Art Design, 2nd Edition**, Churchill Livingstone Inc.: New York (2009).

Chapter in a Book: Authors of the chapter, name of the chapter, In: names of the editors, name of the book, city of publication, publisher, page number, year e.g. Y.L. Hsu, Fractal Dimension, In: C.T. Lin, L.W. Ji, **Fractal Art Design, 2nd Edition**, New York, Churchill Livingstone Inc., 15-28 2009.

Conference/Meeting Presentation: Author(s), title, name of symposium (dates), venue e.g. S.D. Hsu, M. Ho, S. Ou, T. Fan, Development of a Rotor, **Proc. of 24th International AIAA Conference** (30 March-1 April 2009), Bristol, UK (2009).

REVIEW PROCESS:

All manuscripts are reviewed by two qualified reviewers. Decisions will be made as rapidly as possible, and the journal strives to return reviewers' comments to authors within 6 weeks. The editorial board will re-review manuscripts that are accepted pending revision.
