## INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

Tzu Chi Medical Journal is a journal of the Buddhist Compassion Relief Tzu Chi Foundation. The journal includes original research papers of Clinical medicine and basic science, case reports, clinical pathological conferences, and review articles.

The authors confirm that the copyright of this article is hereby transferred to Buddhist Compassion Relief Tzu Chi Foundation effective upon acceptance for publication in: Tzu Chi Medical Journal. However, the following rights are reserved:

- (1) The right to use, free of charge, all or part of this article in future works of their own, such as books and lectures.
- (2) The right to reproduce the article for their own purposes.

As of June 2002, articles covering "The Use of Human Samples in Research" and "Human Experiments" that are submitted for publication, need to be accompanied by a letter of agreement from the relevant review committee.

Articles covering "The use of vertebrates in scientific application planning" that are submitted for publication, need to be accompanied by a letter of approval from the animal experiment management team of the relevant authorities.

All manuscripts submitted for possible publication will be reviewed by the editorial board. The board reserves the right to make revisions. A brief letter to the editor should be included with all submissions, stating that all authors have contributed to the paper, and have never submitted the manuscript to other medical journals. Authors are also encouraged to submit their manuscripts through e-mail to the editorial office of the journal by [tcmj@tzuchi.com.tw](mailto:tcmj@tzuchi.com.tw). Any artwork and figure should be submitted in high quality resolution electronically.

## PEER REVIEW

All manuscripts will be reviewed by at least 2 recognized experts on the subject. The reviews will be blinded, with the reviewers not knowing the names of the authors. When relevant, a biostatistician (member of the editorial board) will review the submitted manuscript.

## SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPTS

Manuscripts may be submitted as hard, typewritten documents or on any type of computer disk. Submit 3 copies of the manuscript including references, tables, and figures. The article should be typed double space with ample margins on each side. Unless specifically indicated in the various categories listed, each manuscript should contain an abstract of 250 words or less (stating the objective, materials and methods, results, and conclusions), introduction, materials and methods, results, discussion, and conclusion.

The maximum length of an article is 3000 words including tables and figures. Each table or figure is estimated to be 250 words. All articles should include a summary in Chinese.

The title page should contain (1) title of the article; (2) first name, middle initial and last name of each author; (3) name of department(s) and institution (s); (4) address of the principal author, or author to whom reprint requests and correspondence should be sent; (5) sources of support in the form of grants; and (6) a short running title of no more than 40 characters, including letters and spaces.

Only recognized abbreviations should be used. Uncommon abbreviations should be defined when first used, and then abbreviated thereafter. All units of measurement and laboratory values must be expressed in SI units and symbols, e.g., cm, mm,  $\mu\text{m}$ , L, dL, mL, kg, g, mg,  $\mu\text{g}$ , ng, pg, Kcal,  $^{\circ}\text{C}$ , msec,  $\text{mm}^3$ , %, etc. Greek Letters should be written in clearly by hand. Pages should be numbered consecutively, beginning with the title page.

## REFERENCES

References should be limited to those cited in the text and numbered as they appear consecutively in the text, with their position in the text indicated. In any one reference with more than 7 authors listed, et al will be used for remaining authors other than the initial 3. For authors cited in the text, surnames and initials of the authors should be written if there are one or two authors; write only the first author's name and use et al for references with more than two authors.

- (1) For journal articles: Surname and initial of author(s), title of article, name of journal, year, volume number, first and last pages. As follows:  
Kuo HC, Tsai TC: The predictive value of urine flow rate and voiding pressure in the postoperative outcome of benign prostatic hypertrophy. *J Formos Med Assoc* 1988; **87**:323-330.
- (2) For books: Surname and initials of author(s), title and subtitle, edition, city, publishing house, year and pages.  
As follows: Jones CJ, Smith TH: *Kidney Disease*, Boston: Little Brown & Company, 1973, pp 50-53.
- (3) For articles or chapters in books: Surname and initials of author(s), title of article, chapter number(if any), surname(other than first), city, publishing house, year and pages. As follows: Weiss MH: Mid-and lower cervical spine injuries, In: Wilkins RH, Rengachary SS, eds. *Neurosurgery*, 1st ed., New York: McGraw-Hill, 1985, pp 1593-1600.
- (4) Reference to articles in press must state name of journal and, if possible, volume and year.

## TABLES

Each table should be typed on a separate sheet of paper and should supplement, not duplicate, the text. The tables should be listed in numerical order and each must have a concise title.

## ILLUSTRATIONS

Black and white photographs should be no larger than 4 × 6 inches; color prints are welcome, with no additional charge to the author once the paper is approved by the editorial board. All illustrations must be numbered, with top side indicated, and cited in the text; concise legends must accompany each illustration.

## GALLEY PROOFS

Galley proofs are sent to the author together with a permission form. Authors must submit written permission from the publisher and author when material is reproduced from other sources.

## RESPONSIBILITY

Manuscripts will be accepted for consideration with the understanding that they are contributed solely to Tzu Chi Medical Journal, have never before been published, nor submitted simultaneously elsewhere, and become the property of the publisher. The publisher is not responsible for the loss of manuscripts through circumstances beyond its control.
