

About the Author

Professor Emeritus HO Peng Yoke, Ph.D., D.Sc., D.Litt. (Hon.), was the Foundation Professor and first Chairman of the School of Modern Asian Studies at Griffith University, where he retired and remained as professor emeritus. Prior to his Griffith appointment, he was the inaugural professor and chairman of the Department of Chinese Studies at the University of Malaya in Kuala Lumpur. He had also served in these capacities at the University of Hong Kong.

Professor Ho devoted his entire career on pursuing interdisciplinary research in the history of science and had collaborated actively with Dr. Joseph Needham at Cambridge University. He acted as Director of the Needham Research Institute in the 1990s and is now its Emeritus Director. He has published extensively in the field of the history of Chinese science, including 23 books and monographs, more than 160 academic papers, and numerous book reviews. Among his major honours include the award of the Doctor of Letters (*honoris causa*) from Edinburgh University, honorary professorships of North-West University, Xian, University of Science and Technology, Beijing, the Chinese Academy of Science, member of Academia Sinica, Taiwan, and Academician of the International Eurasian Academy of Science. Professor Ho lives in retirement in Brisbane but remains active in academic circles.
